Pew Research reports some interesting things about employees in this country. For instance: there are more than 150,000,000 employees in the workforce, membership in unions has declined from a peak of 35% back in 1954 to only 11% today, 71% of people work in the service sector, 10% of the workforce is self-employed, and median annual earnings of full time workers ages 25 to 34Ys old is about \$50,000 for those with a bachelor's degree or more vs. only \$30,000 for high school graduates.

The Bureau of Labor and Statistics (BLS) reports the median number of years employees remain in a job fell about 9% to 4.2Ys in 2016 from 4.6Ys in 2014.

Gizmodo reports some flashlight apps have loaded mobile banking Trojans onto phones through Google Play Store. The apps target banking apps from Wells Fargo, Chase, Citibank and others.
